**CITY OF AURORA ANNOUNCES LOW FIXED RATE
 FOR NATURAL GAS ENDORSEMENT PROGRAM**

Aurora, Ohio, April 12, 2011 – Aurora city officials are pleased to announce they have established a fixed rate for natural gas for residents and small businesses wishing to join the city’s new natural gas program

Those wishing to enroll in the city’s program will enjoy a fixed rate of \$5.85 per Mcf for all gas consumed through their Dominion East Ohio Gas November 2011 billing period. Constellation Energy (NYSE: CEG), a leading competitive energy supplier, recently won a competitive bid process and will replace IGS Energy as the city’s new endorsed supplier, through the May 2013 billing period.

Mayor Lynn McGill said, “We are pleased to continue to offer this program to our residents as another option in their attempts to manage energy costs. The \$5.85 per Mcf rate for our residents compares very favorably to what residents can obtain on their own at this time.” The mayor went on to say, “We are pleased that we were able to lock-in such a low rate for the upcoming months and will set next winter’s rate, later in the year.”

Mayor McGill reminds residents that “this program makes no guarantee of savings and it is completely voluntary. Eligible residents and businesses should expect to receive a notice in the mail from Constellation Energy on or around April 19. The notice will explain the rate, terms and conditions, and various means of enrolling in the City’s natural gas program.” Constellation recommends that residents look for this letter and follow its simple instructions to enroll by phone, mail, fax, or through the Constellation New Energy website.

Mark Berry, vice president of Constellation said, “We are pleased to be the city of Aurora’s newly endorsed supplier. Any resident or small business currently served by another supplier or Dominion East Ohio may join the city’s program by calling Constellation at 1-866-622-6569.”

Berry said “current Constellation customers served under prior contracts may transfer into the city’s program but need to contact Constellation.” He said “residents served by another supplier should be aware of the obligations in an existing contract such as early termination penalties.”
